

POTENTIAL REWARDS FROM THE BEGINNING TO THE END OF A SPECTROSCOPIC CAREER DERIVED FROM ATTENDANCE AT A GRADUATE-STUDENT AND POSTDOCTORAL-FELLOW ORIENTED SYMPOSIUM
